

## JUBILEE STADIUM – CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

The following Conditions of Entry apply to any person (“patron”) attending Jubilee Stadium (the “Venue”). These conditions should be read in conjunction with the conditions of sale appearing on each ticket, which may vary from the Venue’s Conditions of Entry from time to time.

Please note that Conditions of Entry may vary between events.

Management, authorised staff and their contracted representatives have the rights to refuse entry, search, remove patrons, and remove or confiscate any item deemed to be a potential risk to the comfort and wellbeing of patrons attending the Venue.

Venue Management reserves the right to change the Conditions of Entry from time to time as per the hirer request, industry updates and advice from State and Federal Health Departments. It is the sole and exclusive responsibility of the Venue Management to apply such change or exercise any variation on a temporary or permanent basis. ### **Refusal of Entry**

For the comfort, safety and enjoyment of all patrons, Venue Management reserves the right to refuse entry:

- To any patron deemed to be intoxicated and/or disorderly
- To any patron that does not have a valid form of entry or who is unauthorised for access
- Of items which have the potential to cause injury or public nuisance (i.e. large flags/banners, musical instruments, missiles etc.)

### **General conditions**

- Entry to the Venue is subject to the holding of a valid ticket or pass
- Patrons entering the Venue will be subject to security checks, including the inspection/search of any bags and packages brought into the Venue, regardless of size; wand and pat-down searches. Any patron refusing to undergo such security processes will be refused entry to the Venue
- All patrons consent to monitoring by closed circuit television
- For the safety of patrons, leaning on, sitting on or climbing over handrails/balustrades/fences, as well as standing on seats is strictly prohibited
- Seats retract automatically. To avoid potential damage or injury, patrons must check their seat is properly and safely positioned before taking their seat
- Storage or placement of any items or equipment in stairwells, concourses or walkways is strictly prohibited
- Patrons gaining unauthorised access to the Venue and/or the Venue’s playing arena will be removed from the Venue and may be liable for prosecution
- Any patron arrested or detained by NSW Police or evicted from the Venue may be excluded from attending events at the Venue for a minimum of 12 months
- Patrons who cause a disturbance, or refuse to comply with reasonable requests made by staff will be removed from the Venue
- Refusal to comply with a reasonable authorised request or to leave an area of the Venue may result in prosecution
- If patrons contravene any Conditions of Entry, they may have their ticket confiscated and or cancelled without refund or recompense

- The use of cameras/mobile phones/recording devices is prohibited in all dressing rooms and toilets
- It is a condition of entry to the Venue that a patron does not attempt to conceal their identity, either at the point of entry or while inside the Venue. While the Venue will respect cultural differences or medical conditions, it reserves the right to either refuse entry, or to remove anyone who covers their face with a scarf, balaclava, mask, hat or helmet etc.
- Any patron who attempts entry or is found to have entered the Venue after being issued with a current Banning Notice will be subject to prosecution and possible further penalties
- The Venue is a non-smoking venue. This includes electronic cigarettes, personal vaporisers/"vapes", electronic nicotine delivery systems or other battery powered vaporisers. Smoking is not permitted within four (4) meters of any entry point. Patrons wishing to smoke must utilise a pass out at the gates
- Pass outs are available at all operating gates. Patrons are required to scan their valid ticket out and back in for re-entry, through the gate marked on their ticket
- Commercial food products cannot be taken into or from the Venue by patrons. Commercial food is considered as 'recognisable food outlets with a registered trademark and/or foods known as 'fast food'. Homemade foods/package snack foods (i.e. lollies/chips/baby food) are permitted into the Venue. Drinks must be sealed/unopened
- Patrons wishing to bring personal items into the Venue do so at their own risk. Management will not be held responsible for any damages to, loss of, or theft of a patron's personal property
- Umbrellas may be brought into the Venue however cannot be opened in the seating bowl. The use of umbrellas within the Venue should take into account patron comfort (however cannot be opened in the seating bowl/obstruct views of other patrons). Please note umbrellas may be considered a prohibited item for certain events
- Patrons are to respect all others and not engage in any conduct, act towards or speak to any player, match official or any other patron in a manner which offends, insults, humiliates, intimidates, threatens, disparages and vilifies that patron on the basis of that patron's race, colour, region, decent, nationality or ethnic background
- Prams and strollers are not permitted into seating areas and cannot be kept in aisles or other open areas which may impact the safe passage of patrons. Prams and strollers must be folded up and stowed under seats in such a manner that they do not create a trip hazard to patrons moving between seats. Prams left inside gates by patrons are not monitored by staff
- Folding chairs and picnic blankets are permitted into the general admission hill areas only. The general admission hill areas may be enforced as a "Standing Area Only" when capacity is reached, at which time chairs and picnic blankets of any kind will not be permitted
- Unauthorised soliciting and customer surveying is not permitted
- Patrons are not permitted to throw any objects around or within the Venue
- Some sporting events and other activities are dangerous. Patrons viewing such activities do so at their own risk
- Children (under the age of 12 years) must be supervised by a responsible adult or guardian (over the age of 18 years) at all times while in the Venue
- Patrons should take appropriate care for their sun protection and hydration
- The Venue may, from time to time, take photos for publication or promotional purposes

### **Prohibited items**

The following items are not permitted into the Venue:

- Alcoholic beverages

- Illicit drugs/illegal substances
- Glass bottles or breakable containers
- Unsealed beverages of any kind
- Metal containers and cans
- Flares, fireworks or any other explosive device
- Drones or other remote-controlled devices
- Laser pointers or pens
- Balls or other missiles (including inflatable items, frisbees, tennis balls and cricket balls)
- Whistles, hooters and horns drums and significant noise-making instruments, as well as megaphones
- Knives or other dangerous weapons, including toy/imitation weapons
- Professional (long lens) cameras and recording devices for commercial purposes, including any lenses over 200mm
- Poles (including metal flag poles), sticks or oversized flags/banners (1.5m x 1m with flagpoles over 1.5m), and "selfie sticks". Specific conditions may apply for some events regarding the entry of flagpoles, flags and banners. All flags and banners must be pre-registered
- Confetti, shredded paper or register rolls
- Scooters, roller skates, skateboards, hoverboards, bicycles, e-bikes/scooters, or other unauthorised means of personal transportation
- Animals, including dogs and other pets; excluding guide dogs or other assistance animals
- Patrons are not to wear or otherwise display commercial, political or other offensive signage or logos
- Eskies and bags of larger dimensions than 30cm L x 20cm W x 35cm H
- Beach trolleys/carts or push wagons
- Cans of spray paint and marking pens
- Other items as determined by the Venue Management, which may cause injury or present a public nuisance to any user of the Venue

### **Liquor licensing**

The Venue practices the responsible service of alcohol. All patrons entering the Venue are advised that:

- They are entering a licensed premises
- Intoxicated patrons will not be permitted to enter
- Intoxicated patrons will be removed from the Venue
- Patrons in possession of liquor will not be permitted to enter. Checking procedures will apply to prevent patrons possessing liquor from entering
- Alcoholic beverages must not be removed from the Venue
- It is an offence for minors to purchase and consume liquor and it is an offence to purchase liquor for (or supply liquor to) minors or patrons who are intoxicated
- Patrons supplying liquor to minors will be reported to the Police and penalties apply under the Liquor Act 2007
